## Why appoint a nominee company secretary?

Whilst the Companies Act 2006 no longer requires a private company to appoint a company secretary, the duties that were previously the responsibility of the secretary still exist and become the responsibility of the directors if no secretary is appointed. Situations often arise where it may be advisable to appoint an independent third party as company secretary and it is often considered more professional to have the role filled by a professional.

## **Key Points:**

- Appointment of a professional company secretary ensures that the company has access to accurate and up to date information concerning matters of company law.
- o The Companies Act 2006 contains complex legislation, which can take significant time and effort to understand fully.
- o A professional company secretary will help ensure directors are always correctly advised.
- An independent company secretary can provide advice and support for the directors and leave them free to concentrate on operating the business side of the company.
- Appearance matters. Improved perception by potential suppliers or customers and the public in general.
- o "One man" companies can benefit from the service where the director wishes the company to be perceived as a professionally structured organisation.
